Reflections by Pastor Kaylie...

⁶But [the angelic messenger] said to them,

"Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. ⁷But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." Christ has risen, alleluia! Happy Easter Season, Beloveds!

We have made it through the wilderness. We have witnessed the betrayal, death, and crucifixion of Christ. We have seen the empty tomb. The divine messenger told us Christ has been raised and is not here! And what joyous news that is to our ears. As (hopefully) the weather stays warm and the green blade rises beneath our feet, spring (new life) is coming into our world!

We were told on Easter morning to go away from the tomb, this place of death and endings, and go into the world to find Christ. For in this resurrection, it became the beginning of the very Good News of Jesus Christ. An empty tomb proves that God's love conquered death and beat the power of sin and violence. Easter means that God has exposed human violence (through the cross) and overcame it with Love. Easter means that God has taken the brokenhearted and gathered them together into the body of Christ. Easter means that God has taken our despair and guilt

and drawn us deeper into God's arms. Easter means that we are not alone in this broken world.

God has suffered through loneliness, despair, grief, and even the pain of death. Christ has gone ahead of us in death. And if Jesus goes ahead of us in death, can there be any doubt that Christ will be there ahead of us wherever life takes us? Wherever life takes us (through anxious times, hard times, lonely times, etc.) God takes those tombs and empties them for us. So when we get to what feels like the end, like our world is ending, God sends a messenger to tell us to go away.

For there is no life in the tomb. It is emptied. Christ has already beaten sin and death. So run from here, run back to God, and experience new beginnings. Easter reminds us that we are people of hope. We believe that in the end, all will be well. And if it is not well, then it is not the end. For death was just the beginning for Christ. New life is *always* possible.

So, in this new season, may we remember that Christ is ahead of us. Waiting for us and pulling us out of death and into new life. May you remember to hang onto the hope of God, trust in God's promises, and believe in the Love that overcame death. God is far greater than our struggles and our world. Holdfast to hope, beloveds! For Christ has risen, Jesus has risen indeed.
