From the Desk of Pastor Keith

Happy new year! By the grace of God we enter a new year with the songs and stories of Christmas still ringing in our ears.

As I reflect on our celebration of Christmas, what is remarkable to me is that a baby born over 2,000 years ago in an insignificant village in a third world country today rules the hearts and lives of billions of people. In the past 2 millennia countries have risen and fallen. Political dynasties have come and gone. Powerful women and men have stepped to center stage of world history, only to be replaced by someone else. But for 2,000 years people have looked to Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior! Because of Jesus. the world is changing!

Sure, there are a lot of problems in the world; we definitely have work to do. We constantly hear about the problems, but let's not overlook the good things that are happening.

I recently read a newspaper article titled, "Why 2017 Was the Best Year in Human History." The article said, "A smaller share of the world's people were hungry, impoverished or illiterate than at any time before. A smaller proportion of children died than ever before. The proportion disfigured by leprosy, blinded by diseases like trachoma or

suffering from other ailments also fell."

It went on to say, "Every day, the number of people around the world living in extreme poverty (less than \$2 a day) goes down by 217,000 . . . Every day, 325,000 more people gain access to electricity. And 300,000 more gain access to clean drinking water. . . Just since 1990, the lives of more than 100 million children have been saved by vaccinations, diarrhea treatment, breast-feeding promotion and other simple steps."

The author of the article didn't say what accounts for these good things that are happening. But if you ask me, it is because people all over the globe are quietly working to help others. Just like what I see at Olsburg and Walsburg! I see people caring for one another, reaching out to help neighbors, praying for those in need, giving money to feed the hungry, and on and on it goes.

It doesn't always make the news or grab the headlines, but it happens. We may think what we are doing is not much, but it makes a difference in the world.

I don't know what is motivating the millions of people throughout the world who are making good things happen,
