From the Desk of Pastor Keith...

On April 8, Kylea Ricketts and Brooklynn Zoeller were confirmed during the morning worship at Olsburg. Since it has been some time since either congregation had a confirmation service, I thought it would be good for us to reflect on confirmation, why we do it, and most importantly, what it means for us personally.

I dare say, confirmation has been important for both of our congregations since the time when the congregations were formed. Just look at the confirmation pictures displayed in our respective fellowship areas. We don't display pictures of baptisms, or first communions, or weddings, but we do display confirmation pictures. There is something about confirmation which we value greatly.

Since the Reformation, the Lutheran Church has preserved the rite of Confirmation, but the rite has been variously understood. Confirmation has been seen as a time of instruction in the essentials of the faith as set forth in the Small Catechism. It has been seen as the time when one accepts Christ as personal Lord. It has been seen as a moment which adds to Baptism a fuller presence of the Holy Spirit. It has been seen as an act which entitles one to receive Holv Communion and become a member of the church. It has even been seen as a kind of graduation ceremony. Ask people what they

think about confirmation and you will get an amazing variety of responses.

So what is confirmation. Let's keep in mind that Jesus never told the church to confirm people.

Confirmation is not a sacrament in the Lutheran church. Not all Christians are confirmed.

Look through the hymnal and you will not find a service of Confirmation. What you will find is a service called "Affirmation of Baptism." This gives us a great insight into what confirmation is. Confirmation has something to do with Baptism. In fact, it has a lot to do with Baptism! Baptism is God's act. In Baptism God gives us the gift of salvation and eternal life. In Baptism we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit who works faith in us. In Baptism these gifts are fully and completely given to us.

In the service of Affirmation of Baptism (confirmation) we affirm our Baptism. We affirm what God has done and continues to do for us. This service is a way of saying "Yes" to God's action in Baptism. The laying on of hands and prayer for the Holy Spirit in this service confirm that the gift of the Holy Spirit has been given. In response, we reject sin, confess our faith in God and God's saving action, and promise to continue living in the covenant God made with us in Baptism. Continued on the next page I still remember my confirmation. It was, and continues to be, a very meaningful moment in my life and my relationship with God. It wasn't the beginning of my relationship with God, nor was it the end. It was a step along the way. A very significant step. I am very grateful for that step, for it has led to many more steps as my relationship with God has grown and enlarged and matured. This is what I pray will happen for Brooklynn and Kylea, and this is what I pray for you as well.
