Reflections by Pastor Keith...

Broken! We need the healing power of God!

We are about to enter that very sacred time of the year when we recall the story which brings us hope and healing in the midst of the brokenness of our world and our lives.

When Jesus entered Jerusalem that first Palm Sunday, he took on our brokenness. His body became broken with pain and suffering. He experienced broken relationships as trusted disciples and friends betrayed him and denied him and ran away, leaving him all alone on the cross. He endured the brokenness of a justice system which executed an innocent man. His spirit was broken as he cried out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" He then gave up his spirit and breathed his last before being fully and completely broken by death.

If the story ended there, in a grave, there would be no hope or healing for us. But the story didn't end there. On Easter morning Jesus broke the powers of sin and death when he rose from the dead! On Easter morning Jesus burst forth from the grave, alive and well! Therein lies our hope and the source of our healing.

During this season of Lent we have been talking about our brokenness and the healing which God brings to

us through Jesus Christ. Holy Week and Easter is when we pause from our daily routines and sometimes rather hectic schedules to meditate upon the story which gives us hope for the healing of our brokenness and the brokenness of our world.

A year ago we didn't get to come together to hear this story. The COVID-19 pandemic was just beginning and we were starting to see brokenness on a scale we seldom see. A year ago we were just beginning to experience social distancing, the wearing of masks, the work of schools being disrupted, businesses closing, record numbers of people unemployed, and ultimately a staggering number of deaths.

A lot has happened in the past year, much of which we would like to forget. We have learned a lot about brokenness. We have also learned a lot about God, our faithful God, a God of hope and healing, a God who hangs in there with us and who never gives up on us. Throughout this year we have kept the faith. We have loved God. We have loved others. We have continued to live as the people of God.

Now it is time to hear the story of our hope, the story which leads to the healing of our brokenness.

Holy Week and Easter

Palm Sunday - March 28

Follow Jesus as he enters Jerusalem and takes on our brokenness and prepares to die for you. What a Lord! What grace! This service prepares us for the week ahead, a week that is truly Holy!

Maundy Thursday - April 1

On this night Jesus gave his followers the command to love one another and prepared a special meal called Holy Communion. We gather at 7:00 pm at Olsburg to remember the events of that night and to break bread with our Lord and with one another.

Good Friday - April 2

On this Friday we call Good we gather at 7:00 pm at Walsburg to tell the story which is at the heart and center of our faith. Because of Good Friday, there is healing for our brokenness. Do not hurry by the cross on your way to Easter joy, for we know the Risen Lord only through the Crucified Christ.

Festival of Easter - April 4

The Easter season begins with the news that Jesus has risen from the dead! Come, share the joy and exhilaration of Easter! The Lord is risen! He is risen indeed! We have hope! The Easter SonRise service begins at 7:00 am at Walsburg. The Festival Service of Worship at Olsburg begins at 9:00 am. The Festival Service of Worship at Walsburg begins at 11:00 am.

Please pray with me. "Almighty God, you give us the joy of celebrating our Lord's resurrection. Give us also the joys of life in your service, and bring us at last to the full joy of life eternal, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God now and forever. Amen."
