When we think about giving out of abundance, first and foremost, we all need to think about what God has given us in God's abundance. Out of God's abundance, God created the world for us to be caretakers of, -- and what he created was good!

Out of God's abundance and love for us, God gave us his Son, Jesus, so we could be again, be one with God. It was not the leftovers that God gave us, but the abundance.

It makes all the difference in the world (and in our faith journey) when our response back to God is out of our abundance and not the leftovers. We give because God has first given to us.

We like to put things on a comparative scale, so if we could put this response and commitment on a scale of 1 to 10, who would come close to the 10?

Abraham might come close – he was willing to sacrifice his son, Isaac, back to God. Maybe Jesus's disciples would come close, since they left job, home, and family to be a part of Jesus' ministry and didn't really expect anything in return. Possibly Paul, who devoted his life to tell the story of Christ's resurrection and was instrumental in the conversion of many people to Christianity. There are many more examples in the Bible of people being committed to God, that frankly make our commitments look like a paltry ONE on the rating scale.

AND, thank goodness God doesn't measure us on a scale of 1 to 10. Out of God's abundance and because of Christ, we all rate a number 10.

The real question – are we making our commitments with our abundance or are we making our commitments with the leftovers?

Each of us have already made commitments out of our abundance, but we may not think of them as such. When we agreed to make house payments, car payments, cable TV, cell phone, electric bill, propane, life insurance, etc., we made commitments. These are commitments we made, and promised to pay, whenever those bills come due. These are commitments taken off the top of our paychecks and earnings, or the abundance of our earnings – and not what was leftover at the end of the month.

Most of our expenses are made for ourselves and the people we love. This is good. And, when we look at the our love for God and who we are called to give back to God in response to that love, let's face it – leftovers is sometimes all God really receives.

How can we better make a commitment of our faith back to God? We have good news and there is no need to hoard it. Go and make disciples of all nations, is Christ's command. Isn't this really what we are about as the church?

We are a church that strives to share a living daring confidence in God's grace. I look forward to our commitments of all that we have – time, talent and money being gifts of abundance, in response to God's awesome grace, so that all God's children might know the hope and promise of new live through Jesus Christ.

Abundance or left overs? God has chosen abundance!

Reports

Secretary's Report: No report presented.

Olsburg and Walsburg Special Congregational Meeting Date

Olsburg – Special Congregational Meeting, June 3 – Immediately following worship

Reason for Special congregational meetings in each congregation?

Each congregational council has voted unanimously to hold a special congregational meeting to vote on a change of call for Gordon L. Sandquist to ordained status.

Gordy has been attending Luther Seminary through his entire tenure with us, and will be graduating with a Master of Divinity on May 20, 2012. He has been approved for ordination by the Central States Synod of the ELCA and seminary faculty and assigned to the Central States Synod.

Because he already has a call to both the Walsburg and Olsburg Congregations, this vote will not be to retain or reject his continued ministry and mission with the two congregations, but to affirm what the Seminary and Candidacy Committee has approved. He must have a call in this capacity from both congregations in order to be ordained.

What will change with a passing vote, will be his roster status (from Associate in Ministry to Ordained), and how he relates to the bishop of the Central States Synod. Currently, because he is an Associate in Ministry, he is only allowed to carry forth full pastoral responsibilities in the Walsburg – Olsburg Parish, under the bishop's authorization.

This is an important vote for the parish and Walsburg Congregation, and we hope you will mark your calendars to participate in the special congregational meeting. As per constitutional requirements, you must satisfy the basic standards of participation to have the privilege to vote. We look forward to seeing you, after worship as we step into our future mission and ministry.
