Pastor Letter...

What if? (Some "stewardship thoughts)

What if we were able to totally re-think how we shape our communal life around the topic of money – not so much for the financial health of the church, but (so that) we might knock down barriers that have been getting in the way of people's desire to be part of Christian community.

We know that significant numbers of people in our communities (culture) have never learned about giving money away, and these same folks have never learned to manage money in a healthy way. In addition, for many younger people, it seems the economy has dealt them a bad hand. Some have massive student loan debt, under-water mortgages, daycare struggles and inconsistent job security. It seems like there is this "big bag of fear" that is near impossible to set down – "How will we make it to the end of the month?" "Which bills do we NOT pay right now?" and the worst, "I am alone in this struggle and ashamed."

So, **What if** church could become a place where we can learn together how not to be afraid? What if we could come together (out of isolation and into community) to figure this out? Because, if the church is about Good News, then this Good News must also extend to our life with

money! (it sounds a little weird – but it is true...)

The story we ground ourselves in week after week, rests in the promise that we are never alone, and that God is trustworthy. The Spirit is always calling us out of the lie of isolation and into community. The biblical message tells us that we are given enough for this day, and that God believes in us enough to make us stewards. Jesus tells us that a life given away is what gives it all meaning. This IS Good News!

So here is the really big question – **What if** church were to be the place where people of all ages can hear this really Good News, and also learn things about money (in our day and age)? **What if** church is the place where people are invited to make a realistic personal budget? **What if** church is the place where all are encouraged to align the way they used money with their deepest values? AND, **what if** church is the place where each of us discovered that this money (your money) has the power to change the world when you give it away?

None of this will be easy to accomplish... So what! What if?

Sonja and I went on a couple of day hikes, had a couple of unscheduled reunions with church worker friends from the past who found out we were in the area (actually, our kids were at the same camp week and we didn't know it), I had three days I finished a book in a day (only one was ministry related), and we relaxed... and, I spent time

with friends I hadn't seen in over a decade.

We got home from vacation late Saturday evening, July 27, and as I was preparing for worship the next day, I was checking my e-mail and saw a note from Pastor Bruce's family that he had passed away. I opened up my calendar, saw that Tuesday and Wednesday (July 30 & 31) were actually open and decided I needed to head back out to Denver for the memorial services. And once again, it had been a decade since I had seen most of the folks who gathered for this.

In the midst of all this travel (two of these trips were unplanned) – I was reminded of how important it is to reconnect with friends from the past. This reconnection helps remind us who we are, and more importantly – whose we are. It could be that many of my connections are "church" related, but I was thankful for all the "faith journey," "God talk" and "hopes for the future" conversations...
