## **Education and The Reformation**

Martin Luther was a strong advocate of education. That's not surprising since he was a trained educator. But his encouragement and support of education went deeper than that. It grew out of his study of the Bible and his desire that everyone grow in their understanding of the Scriptures and in their relationship to Christ.

Luther was very involved in his own children's spiritual growth. In fact, his Small Catechism, which was published in 1529 and is still used in the church today, was compiled in part as a result of the religious instruction he led in his own home. "When I get up in the morning. I pray with the children the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and then some Psalm," he said in a sermon in 1530. Repetition of prayers and Scripture, he believed, made one strong in faith. That was true for him as well. He said. "Here one forever remains a learner. Though I am a great doctor, I haven't yet progressed beyond the instruction of children."

Luther was an advocate of education for all ages, women and men, girls and boys. Lutherans have continued this emphasis on education to this day. They believe that education in the content and practices of the Christian faith is essential. They have a long-standing focus on education of children and youth in the home and in the church. Adult learning happens in conversation, in worship, in service to others, and in a variety of formal and informal educational efforts.

Wherever Lutherans have gone in the world, they have established schools for children and youth, teaching religion and other subjects because they deem all aspects of God's world worthy of study. Around the globe, they support thousands of early childhood, primary, and secondary schools, as well as colleges and universities and seminaries.

Life together

Lutherans support public education. Many Lutherans serve as teachers and aids, school administrators, and board members at all levels of public education. In 2007 the ELCA adopted a social statement titled "Our Calling in Education." In this statement they committed themselves to work to ensure that all have access to high-quality education for the common good. For the sake of serving the world, Lutherans value education not only in the Christian faith, but also about the world we serve.

## Worship and Children

Worship is a wonderful activity for people of all ages, including children. Even very young children respond to the music, the liturgy, and the actions of worship. While it is hard for young children to sit for an hour (it can even be hard for adults!), here are a few tips to help them worship:

- Smile at a child and shake his or her hand during the sharing of the peace. Remember to smile and greet the parents as well. A smile goes a long way, a frown can discourage for life.
- + Sit where your children can see what is going on.
- + Encourage children to do all the actions sitting, standing, shaking hands, making the sign of he cross, walking forward for a blessing during communion. As they get older, they can help with taking up the offering, lighting candles, and greeting people.
- + When children are able to read, point out the words and songs in the bulletin and hymnal. Encourage them to participate.

Children are capable of participating in much of the worship service. Whether you have a child or not, we can all help the littlest ones among us to participate in worship. May we all come to know the rich blessings of worshiping together!
