From the Desk of Your Pastor

Stewardship Season?

In many congregations around the country, the month of October brings in the season of Stewardship. It is a season when the stewardship committee rolls out their program or campaign to encourage people who participate in the congregation to make their annual pledges, hopefully striving each year to come closer to giving a tithe (a 10% pledge of the gross income of the family) to the work of God through the church. And at the end of the stewardship program, which might include a sermon series, bible studies, temple talks, testimonies, printed appeal brochures and such, -- the goal is for everyone in the congregation to fill out a pledge card (or a promise of intent) for what the plan to give in the coming fiscal year.

This is all good and fine, but what most churches are finding out is that talking about stewardship for a couple weeks a year isn't really what stewardship is about. It is about talking and living faith and finances throughout the year. AND it is about focusing more on giving as a faithful act of discipleship rather than getting enough money to get the church's bills paid. We as follower of Jesus Christ, MUST have generosity at the very core of our being. This is what makes for healthy stewards and faithful

followers of Jesus.

So, I have a confession to make. Sonja and I have been generous beyond a tithe in other congregations and seasons of our life. I began tithing when I was back in Minnesota at the age of 25. Sonja and I talked about tithing to our congregations before we got married AND, for the past six years, while one or both of us have been in seminary, paying tuition bills four times a year of \$2,000 to \$5,000 each quarter (depending on the course load we took), I have not been at all faithful in my giving to the ministry of God through the work of the church. It is time for me to move more intentionally toward a tithe so that I can be a better witness (with integrity) of all that God has given. If you haven't considered your giving lately, will you join me?
