From the Desk of Your Pastor

God's Work, Our Hands

Sunday, September 21, a dozen folks from Walsburg Lutheran Church gathered at the Leaonardville Nursing Home for an afternoon of service. They participated with "God's work, Our hands," a coordinated day of service through the ELCA. At latest report, there were over 4,000 congregations throughout the United States who have been involved in service projects this past month.

The group from Walsburg had plenty of lawn tools, energy, laughter and good conversation, as we weeded, mulched, trimmed hedges, pruned trees and got covered in some kind of nettle. The back gardens of the Leonardville Nursing Home (which are used by residence and family) look much better also!

Presiding Bishop Eaton (the ELCA "big" bishop) states this — "When one congregation or a group of congregations gather for service in their local communities, they are the church in that place, taking care of that part of God's vineyard." — We really are the church together, for the sake of the world...

What next??? There is so much that both Walsburg and Olsburg Lutheran Churches do in their respective communities and around the globe through the

ELCA, Lutheran World Relief, World Hunger, etc... And I am thankful. If you see an opportunity to be "the church together, for the sake of the world," please take some time to pray about that, gather a group together, and spend some time "taking care of that part of God's vineyard..." – Thanks be to God!

Just What Is "A Month of Tithe?"

In the Old Testament book of Malachi, there is a little known verse that helps to set the foundation. "Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house, and thus put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts; see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down from you an overflowing blessing." (Malachi 3:10) Captured in this verse are a couple of significant tasks and opportunities for the people of God...

First, God says honor me (with a full tithe), then God says "put me to the test," and finally God says trust me... If you are like me, I get a bit anxious when someone suggests putting God to the test.

Yet, in this Old Testament passage God is saying exactly that "put me to the test." It is the only place in scripture where there is a clear and concise call to "put God to the test,"

AND it is very significant that it is centered around the thing throughout all ages that has most gotten in the way of our relationship with God – our stuff (in their culture it was mostly the harvest, and in our culture it is mostly money, both of which are used to get more stuff...)

This year, both Olsburg and Walsburg will once again be participating in Camp Tomah Shinga's "quarter challenge" during the month of October. These dollars (quarters) raised help make camp more affordable for many young people in the region, and a week of camp changes lives. For some, it's a week of "confirmation camp" where the group lives in committee with others and each participant is affirmed in the truth that God loves them, God matters, and (they) matter to God. For others, it is a week of fun and games, worship and bible study, and an experience of how following Jesus makes a difference in the world.

Regardless of why they might show up for a week of camp, at some point in their life, they will look back to their week at camp and discern if in fact they are participating in the world as a fully devoted follow of Jesus Christ. Also – those counselors who care for and lead discussions during the week of camp, a high percentage of them go on in life to be leaders in the church in some way.

Adult Bible Study - 1 and 2 Timothy, and

This fall I have chosen a short study that looks at The Pastor Epistles. 1 and 2 Timothy and Titus are highly valued as New Testament writings, and yet they are also among the most discredited... Why the paradox?

They have been valued for a number of reasons. They helped to establish the classic pattern of ministry and church structure (bishop, presbyter, deacon) which wine each time we celebrate the sacrament. was important to the early (Catholic) church in overcoming the severe challenges from Marcionites and Gnosticism, which has enabled the church to endure for two millennia. They also helped to establish a pattern of "the truth," "the faith," and "sound teaching" as a vardstick by which to judge and ward off false teaching and heresy. Less obviously, they helped to secure the place of Paul within the NT canon.

If you'd like to find out a little more about these books of the New Testament, show up for this learning and discussion opportunity. We should be able to complete interested (785-747-7831) in 1st Communion or it by the new year...
