Worship in October and November

While we are still in the long "green" season of Pentecost, all around us we are beginning to see gold, orange and scarlet. The changing of the season brings with it a consciousness of a harvest of deeds and of lives. It is a time to reconsider, to reassess, and to refocus the intent and purpose of our lives.

We Celebrate the Reformation

On October 31 of 1517, Martin Luther nailed 95 theses to the door of the Castle church in Wittenberg, Germany, announcing his willingness to debate other scholars on the topic of indulgences. It is this act that lit the spark that became known as the Reformation. On this day we acknowledge the great truth that we are saved by God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ. This day urges us to pray for the ongoing renewal of the church in our day.

We Celebrate with the Saints

Each year on the first Sunday in November we observe the Festival of All Saints. On this day we remember and give thanks to God for the faith and witness of those who have gone before us. Since its founding in 1873, 142 years ago, Walsburg Lutheran Church, northeast of Leonardville, has been a "place for many to gather" to praise and proclaim the Word and to be in God's ministry. As the psalmist says in Psalms 99:9: "Exalt the Lord our God, and worship at His holy hill, for holy is the Lord our God."

The artwork displayed on this float was designed and painted by Maury Berggren of Manhattan, who attended Leonardville grade school and graduated from Leonardville High School.

Today we remember those who have faithfully prayed, served, and sacrificed for the progress of God's Kingdom here. On this float today, we honor long time members, Bart and Norma Berggren Coutermarsh, who have actively been involved in many ministries at Walsburg throughout the years.

Church Records Preserved at Olsburg

In February, Olsburg Lutheran received a letter from the Old Mill Museum in Lindsborg regarding preservation of old church records. Over the past few years they have been working on a project to help preserve the history and records of Swedish-founded churches across Kansas. This project helps preserve our Swedish-American heritage for future generations and makes sure that there are back-up copies should anything happen to original items.

On September 1st and 2nd, Sven Hennig, representing ArkivDigital based in Lyrestad, Sweden and Lenora from the Old Mill Museum, Lindsborg, were here making copies of our oldest records. They wanted records earlier then 1940. At times, they had two cameras set up to make the copies. We found transfer slips from the 1800's that were carried by individuals from Sweden to our church. Sven and Lenora were very happy to see these papers as well as old record books. Sven arrived in the U.S. in early July and said he would not return to Sweden until late September or October.

We hosted a "Come and Go" coffee time for anyone interested in the project and a few members and non-members attended. One of the first things he wanted when he got to our church was a cup of coffee!!
