From the Desk of Your Pastoral Leaders

Peace to You!

When the angel showed up to Zechariah in the temple, Zechariah was never the same. Not only was he mute from questioning the angel, he, along with his wife, held the responsibility of raising a child worthy of his calling. It is safe to say that Elizabeth, his elderly wife, physically embraced the change that went along with raising the prophet that would introduce Jesus to the world. One might say that it was a time of holy chaos for this quiet couple.

The angels were on the move again. They came to Mary to tell her about her impending role and then later to Joseph to fill him in on the story so that he might answer the call to serve as the earthly father of Jesus, the savior of the world, A.K.A. God's only son. The striking characteristic about both of these spiritual giants is there unconditional trust and surrender to God's agenda. Here again, the angel of the Lord showed up and every thing changed. Was this a time of Holy Spirit madness?

The interesting part of the story is that in the midst of all of these life altering announcements, changes, visions and events, the goal is "peace." The prophecy that flew out of Zechariah's mouth after he named his baby declared that the role of John was to announce how his son would participate in the realization of God's promise in the world which would bring peace via salvation. John would help the people get ready for the one who was "to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace." (Luke 1:79) Later, an angel showed up to speak with the shepherds. When the angle began to proclaim the good news, an entire army of angels showed up to help, "Glory to God in the highest heaven and on earth peace

among those who he favors," (Luke 2:14)

So, what we have here in these first short verses of Luke's Gospel is age old prophecy remembered, initiated, and in the process of moving God's people towards fulfillment – toward a time of peace. While the ending didn't pan out as most had thought, God made the promise a reality. Now the world has no need to fear death. We are claimed people who live under the promise of the resurrection. Peace is at hand...isn't it?

If it is finished, if God's promised is realized then why doesn't our world seem peaceful? Why are there still countless wars, hunger and preventable disease in the world? Why are we still living in bondage to sin, fear and death?

God's Kingdom is complete buy not yet fully revealed, and God invites us into this art of revelation so that all might live in the hope and the peace. We have been given a "foretaste of the feast to come."

What does that mean for God's earthly disciples? That means telling our own stories of faith to others. It means venturing out and risking a little by sharing with others what Christmas means to us – beyond the tradition of food, presents and family gatherings. Who knows, maybe an angel will show up to help us along the way...then again I wouldn't wish that kind of holy chaos on anyone.

As we all surrender to the holy chaos of Jesus coming to the world, may we know the love that passes all understanding, and may that love guard our hearts and give us all peace.

Reports

Secretary's report: Floyd moved and Kristi seconded to approve the meeting minutes from September 17. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report: The treasurer, Susan Adams, reviewed the report. Our contract with Fox Business is finished. Joyce moved and Willis seconded to accept the report as presented.

Pastor's report:

- † Pastor Gordy reported that he had conducted two funerals: Pat Johnson, member of the congregation, and Eunice Webster, mother of Jan Cooper.
- † Gordy met with the worship team to select hymns for the next few months.
- † Thanksgiving worship service will be held at Olsburg on the Wednesday evening before Thanksgiving.
- † The Grace Ways Bible study will begin in November.
- † Confirmation: A student from St. Mark's Lutheran Church, Waterville, KS, has been added to the class.
- † Pastor Gordy would like to take vacation time from December 29 to January 4. He requested that we count January 4 Sunday as one of the vacation Sundays in 2008. Motion made by Joyce and seconded by Kristi that we approve Pastor Gordy's request. Motion carried.
- † Pastor Gordy has agreed to serve as an assistant boy's basketball coach for the Blue Valley Middle School. Pastor Gordy views this as ministry in the community

Old Business

- † Outside lighting - Mitch Webster will not be able to do the electrical work. Jim will check with another electrician and will check with Lester Krause to see if he can dig the trench.
- † Parsonage sale update - Jim distributed the contract prepared by Todd Sheppard for the council to review. Donica will ask Tom Nelson if he would be available to answer questions when the contract is presented at the special congregational meeting. The contract with terms and price for the sale of the parsonage as written by Todd Sheppard with Charlson and Wilson was received and will be presented to the congregation for approval on

October 26. The constitution was reviewed with regard to the divestiture of property and the procedure outlined was followed.

- † Luther League - The group met at Tom and Donica's on Oct. 12. The silent auction at Walsburg's 135th Anniversary celebration made \$800; the group served lunch at Alan and Sharon Hubbard's horse sale and made about \$400. The Luther League will be selling energy efficient light bulbs.
- † The Christmas home tour will be held on December 14.
- † Church insurance: Church Mutual Insurance Company will wait until March to meet with us since our current policy doesn't expire until June 2009.
- † Spraying the Church: Susan will check with her husband Mitch about spraying the church for insects.
- † Christmas party: A tentative for a Christmas gathering with church council members has been selected for December 17.

New Business

- † A letter from the trustee of the Palmer M. Mellgren Trust was read. Mr. Mellgren's Trust has provided a gift of \$7,500 for improvements to the physical plant of the church as determined by the church council and approved by the congregation. Joyce will send a thank-you letter to Dave and Linda Mellgren.
- † A thank-you note from Gordy Sandquist for the \$500 scholarship was read.
- † Joint Budget Meeting - Gregg Gibson, Jim Nelson, Susan Adams, and Joyce Cantrell will meet with representatives from the Walsburg Council to develop the Joint Parish Budget for 2009.
- † New Council Members - After the congregational elections on October 26, the new council members will be invited to the November meeting.
- † Installation of all council members will take place on January 18.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.



Sonja's Book Review of: *The Purpose of Christmas* written by, Rick Warren

I'm a sucker for Christmas books so I decided to check out Rick Warren's book on Christmas. Many people might already recognize his name. He is the author of the "Forty Days of Purpose" program that captured the attention of churches of all denominations, helping them to find clarity in their existence. *The Purpose of Christmas* falls into the same genre, offering a time to pause and reflect on what Christmas is all about. In true Rick Warren fashion, he cuts to the chase and highlights the most important elements involved in this portion of our Christian Story, lifting the heart of the events out of denominational boundaries and placing them out in the open, free from the institutional baggage that often bogs down the movement and awareness. Likewise, he cannot tell the story of the birth without linking it to the events of death and resurrection. The birth is not significant without the prophecy of death and the promise of the resurrection. Keeping that in mind, Warren divides his book into three sections and unpacks his ideas with speed and efficiency. Christmas is a time of *celebration* because of God's love seen in the gift of his Son given to the world. Christmas is a time of *salvation* seen in the Easter parts of the story of Jesus. Finally, Christmas is a time of *reconciliation* helping all to see that what was given more than 2,000 years ago continues to be available to us right here, right now. Peace on earth is still a possibility. He calls each person to task in this section. Peace starts with you.

While I love Rick Warren because he nails the issue, I always struggle with two things in his theology as a Lutheran Christian. First, he says with clarity that salvation is secure. It was accomplished through Jesus 2,000 years ago. It is a gift that no one can earn. That part I agree with – Amen. Later in his writing, he uses the language of "accepting the gift of

salvation thought praying a specific prayer." Is it ritual or conditional action? I'm not sure. That makes me wince a little because it gives us control over something that is clearly beyond our control. Salvation is God's action on us, not our action on God. As a Lutheran, I have learned that I can negotiate the acceptance language by simply transforming it into "response to the gift" language. The second thing that I have always struggled with is his pre-destination theology. He might write, "God has a plan and purpose for your life and it is already mapped out in advance with great detail." Again I wince a little when I encounter that kind of language. Lutherans are pretty particular about their free will and that kind of language steals away a large portion of it. We are pre-destinarians to the extent that we believe that God has secured our future and our place is indeed in heaven, as promised by the risen Lord. The rest of our lives, our vocations, our service, our worship, our learning, is our response to the good news. We have the opportunity and the call to come into alignment with God to share the good news with the world, but discerning the path on this journey is part of our work in this world. No one ever said it would be easy – simply reflect on Mary, the mother of Jesus for a moment. She had a tough row to hoe, and she did it with incredible faith and trust.



Do I recommend this book?

Absolutely. It is a fast read and it has a pretty cover that screams, "Leave me on the coffee table for someone who might need some simple way to enter into the story of Christmas in a more meaningful fashion." The theological stuff can get worked out later. This book is about promise and hope. That is a gift that never stops giving. Enjoy.
