Reflections by Pastor Keith

Who is Jesus? What did he say? Did he mean what he said? Does he have something to say to us today? Can his words shed light not only on our personal lives, but also on what is happening in the world these days?

These are questions people are asking today. They would like to know more about what this firstcentury, brown-skinned Jewish rabbi born in what is now Palestinian territory has to say. They still want to listen to him. And so do we!

The season of Lent is a time to ask ourselves, are we listening to what Jesus said? Are we watching what he did? Are we following what he said and what he did? Are we wanting, needing, longing to reconnect with Jesus in a time like this?

It seems to me that many people today have become disconnected from Jesus. Many are no longer following his teachings, living with his values, seeking the Kingdom of God which he came to bring us. If the followers of Jesus are not acting like the "salt" and the "light" that he intended us to be, it is no wonder that society can easily unravel and polarize around fear and divisions. When we fail to be the "yeast" or the "leaven" a culture needs, we should not be surprised when individualism, selfishness, power, and wealth predominate over any commitment to serve each other and the common good.

This Lent we want to go back to Jesus himself and explore some of the questions he asked or the questions which he provoked. The midweek Lenten services will seek to engage Jesus through these questions. Questions such as these: "What is truth?" (John 18:38). "Who is my neighbor?" (Luke 10:29). "What is greatness?" (Luke 22:24-28). "Why are you afraid?" (John 6:20). "When did we see you hungry, or thirsty, or a stranger, or naked, or sick, or in prison?" (Matthew25:37-39).

The season of Lent begins on Wednesday, February 26. On that day, each congregation will observe Ash Wednesday with evening services. The service at Olsburg will begin at 6:00 p.m. and the service at Walsburg will begin at 7:15 p.m. The following five midweek services will alternate between the two churches, with Walsburg hosting on March 4. On these five Wednesdays a soup supper will be served beginning at 6:00 p.m. with worship following at 7:00 p.m. The Holden Evening Prayer service will be sung at these services.

Lenten Worship Schedule

A soup supper will be served each Wednesday evening before our Lenten worship service. March 4—6:00 p.m. at Walsburg March 11—6:00 p.m. at Olsburg March 18—6:00 p.m. at Walsburg March 25—6:00 p.m. at Olsburg April 1—6:00 p.m. at Walsburg Each soup supper will be followed by a worship service.

When we first started our soup suppers, they were simple: bread and soup. This simple meal reminded us of what Jesus did for us as he fasted for forty days, suffered through humiliation and beatings, and was crucified on the cross. This was a time for reflection and contemplation along with fellowship. During our Lenten season this year, we will once again return to a simple meal before our Wednesday night worship: soup and bread and a time for discussion and contemplation with our brothers and sisters in Christ. The location for the five mid-week services will alternate between the two churches. Walsburg will host three services, with In-Service committees providing the simple meal. Olsburg will host two services, for which sign-up sheets will be available for volunteers to provide the soup and bread.
