From the Desk of Pastor Keith...

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, zeal in faith and life. the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you!

The season of Lent begins on Wednesday, March 6. On that day, each congregation will observe Ash Wednesday with evening services. The service at Olsburg will begin at 6:00 p.m. and the service at Walsburg will begin at 7:15 p.m. The following five midweek services will alternate between the two churches, with Olsburg hosting on March 13. A soup supper will be served beginning at 6:00 p.m. with worship following at 7:00 p.m.

The Seasons of our Lives

This Lenten season we will gather each Wednesday evening for worship and explore "The Seasons of our Lives."

The word "Lent" comes from an Old English word meaning "to lengthen." This is the season of the between the seasons of nature and year when the earth begins to awaken from its winter sleep. The days lengthen, the sun's rays begin to warm the earth, and ground is broken in preparation for planting seeds. This is also the time when the church observes a season called Lent, a time of turning over the crusty soil of sin in our lives and awakening to God's gift of new life. This is the time when the church prays for God to renew our

Not many weeks ago the days of autumn were giving way to the days of winter. The days were growing shorter and the earth was growing colder. In the midst of those days the church observed a season called Advent, a word which means "to come." It was dark and cold outside, but our lives were filled with hope, the certainty that the Son of God is coming to bring us into the Light of God's new day.

Before long summer days will be upon us, days of sunlight and warmth, days just right for growing crops and gardens. Summer time is when the church observes the long "green season." The green paraments on the altar and pulpit remind us that the Spirit of God is working in our lives, growing strong, fruitful people.

There is a strong connection the seasons of the church. As the marvelous hymn Great Is Thy Faithfulness declares:

Summer and winter and springtime and harvest, sun, moon, and stars in their courses above join with all nature in manifold witness to thy great faithfulness, mercy and love.

God is at work in the seasons of nature and God is at work in the seasons of the church to bring us to a deeper awareness of God's work in our lives and in the world around us.

Come and be part of the Lenten experience each Wednesday evening beginning on March 6.

Awaken To Grace!

This is the time of the year when the earth begins to awaken from its winter sleep. In the church, we call it Lent. During this Lenten season we will gather each Sunday and "Awaken To Grace!"

The Scripture readings for these Sundays follow Jesus from his temptation in the wilderness to days just before he was arrested and nailed to the cross. We watch and listen as Jesus addresses questions about how we should respond when tragedy strikes and how we should handle feelings of resentment and the urge to seek revenge and much more. And what we witness is grace in action!

The Lenten journey will invite us to awaken to God's grace. We will be challenged to plow the crusty soil of our lives, pull up the weeds of sin, and plant fresh seeds of life. All the while we will keep our eyes on the cross and the empty tomb and let the light of Christ's death and resurrection awaken us to the work of God's grace in our lives and in the world.

Join the gathering each Sunday morning and let seeds of new life be planted and the new shoots fed and watered by the Word of God and our Lord's Holy Meal.

Let Us Pray

Please pray with me. "O God of grace, you bid your people cleanse their hearts and prepare with joy for the paschal feast. Renew our zeal in faith and life, and bring us to the fullness of grace that belongs to your children, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."
