Reflections by Pastor Keith

Cluttered. Busy. Exhausting. Complicated. Confusing. Anxious. Muddled. Messy. Unclear. Do these words describe your life? Does your life need some spring cleaning?

Good news! Lent is here! Lent is the time to do spring cleaning - of your life, of who you are, of how you spend your days. It is a time for renewal. It is a time for re-focusing on what is most basic and foundational in your life. It is a time for rediscovering what is at the center of your life. For those of us who follow Jesus, what is at the center of our lives is Jesus!

Can we agree that this Lent we will spend more time with Jesus? We will listen more carefully to what he says. We will make it a priority to come to Holy Communion every time it is offered (after all, this is where Jesus gives Himself to us most fully and completely). We will spend more time talking with him in prayer. We will try more earnestly to do what he tells us to do.

Of course, that means we will probably have to do less of something else. If we are honest, many of us spend more time watching TV than we do hanging out with Jesus. Many

of us are more faithful in listening to the news of the day than we are in listening to Jesus. Many of us are more engaged in sports than we are engaged in worship. Many of us spend more money on snacks and drinks and entertainment than we spend on supporting the church and helping those in need. Take a look at your life. There is probably something that you can do less of so that you can do more with Jesus.

The truth is - Jesus has given you everything! Forgiveness. Hope. Community. Love. Purpose. Freedom from the curse of sin and death. Life with God. What blessings would you add to this list?

There is a reason Jesus is the center of your life. He is your Savior, your Friend, your Lord, the One who connects you with God! Don't let him be pushed to the periphery. Keep him at the center of your life.

When Jesus is at the center, the rest of your life has a way of falling into place. Life becomes more manageable. More satisfying. More fulfilling. More peaceful. More filled with joy. More what you want it to be. (continued on page 2)

Pastor Keith noted that the Synod would like an estimate of our anticipated giving for year 2020. In 2019, the congregation gave \$6500 to the ELCA. The Council agreed to advise the Synod we anticipate our giving will be the same as 2019, with the hope of giving more.
