Reflections by Pastor Keith

It is May and plants are growing! the ground. When it rains the The Flint Hills are greening up. Trees are leafing out. Irises are blooming. It is a wonderful time of the year!

Not only is nature displaying its beauty all around us, nature is also seeking to teach us about God and our lives.

Jesus frequently used images from nature to illustrate what life with God is like - he talked about the lilies of the field, the seed that grows by itself, the four types of soil, the growth of the mustard seed, the tree and its fruit, the laws of sowing and reaping, the vine and the branches.

In Matthew 6, Jesus says, "See the lilies of the field, how they grow." The word "see," means more than simply look at or admire. The Greek word means "learn," "study," or "research" and to do so with intensity. What is it that we are to intensely study? Jesus says, "see how they grow." He wants us to look at plants and learn about life and growth and even about God.

So let's start with the roots. A good root system is essential for a healthy plant. Without good roots, a plant will die. Roots absorb water and nutrients from

roots of plants absorb the water and send life-giving water to the plant.

Jesus said, "I am the living water." We need the living water of Jesus! That's why the Bible says, "As you therefore have receive Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him." (Colossians 2:6-7)

It is Jesus who provides life giving water for us. It is Jesus who can make us truly alive alive to God, alive to ourselves. alive to other people. It is Jesus who can give us life that is truly worth living. We need to sink our roots deep into Christ where they can absorb the life-giving water that he provides.

Roots are also essential because they anchor plants to the ground. That's important in the face of strong Kansas winds. Without a strong root system, plants can be uprooted and blown away.

In Ephesians 4, the Bible, says "We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine."

Everyday we are inundated with information. We are exposed to many different teachings and

philosophies about life. It is easy to get turned around, to get mixed up, to be blown away. And that's exactly what will happen if we don't have a strong root system.

Now a strong root system doesn't just automatically appear. We are not born with it. And we don't get it watching TV or searching the internet. It comes from Jesus. Only Jesus can give us the foundation, the stability, the strength, the endurance to withstand the violent winds which can uproot our lives.

"I am the vine, you are the branches," said Jesus. When we are connected to Christ, we are connected to the tree of life and our lives are anchored and grounded in that which cannot be blown away. When we are connected to Christ, we can thrive and prosper and lead healthy and productive lives.

Sink your roots deep into Christ. For it is here, in God's Word, that our roots find the rich soil which is filled with life-giving nutrients. It is here, at God's Table, that our roots are watered and fed. It is here, among other Christians, that our roots find strength and stability. Our lives need to be rooted in Christ. We need to be connected to and supported by Christ and the Body of Christ.

Plants teach us the value of roots. God's Word teaches us the value of being rooted in Christ!
