From the Desk of Your Pastoral Leaders...

The Spirit is stirring and subtle changes begin to take shape as the people of God listen for how God calls each person and each church into a particular future of ministry for the sake of the world.

This process of becoming everything God has called us to be is hard work. It takes discipline, focus and commitment

from everyone. It isn't driven by one person or a small group of pastors but rather is embraced by all so that it authentically reflects God's work through the people. The gift in the midst of this work is joy – a joy in knowing that each person is working in tandem with God in the world for the sake of God's mission in the world.

Does it happen just by showing up to worship every Sunday and occasionally taking on a service project or hosting a luncheon? I don't know. What I do know is that "just going through the motions" won't be enough for us to be the church that God had in mind. It isn't about buildings, counting service projects or having the best dinners. It is about being in living

relationship with God and with God's people and listening for how we all can share God's love in the world – not just in the church. Maybe your specific gifts and calling will involve a luncheon or a

service project, but keep in mind these are avenues to reflect your faith, they aren't the end of the line. The part we often forget is that all we do is "for the sake of the world." The church in itself is a gathering place and also a sending place so that the bulk of ministry happens Monday through Saturday. It is living the question, "What is God up to and how might I participate?"

These are my reflections as I learn more about the Partnership for Missional Church. As we continue to discern our future vision, my hope is that these golden nuggets of learning and leading can guide us along the way.

May all the places that you are sent this June reveal opportunities for you to share the promise of Jesus Christ.

Council Highlights

The Olsburg Church Council met at 7:00pm on Wednesday, April 15, 2009. Vice Chairman Jim Nelson called the meeting to order. Pastor Gordy led the group in prayer. Members present: Laura Clifton, Kirby Burklund, Jan Cooper, Jim Nelson, Pastor Gordy Sandquist, Joyce Cantrell, Willis Poppe, Mike Apley, and Kristi Fronce.

We opened the meeting with a reading from 1 Corinthians 12:1. A short group discussion followed the reading.

Reports

Secretary's report: Jan moved to approve the report. Mike seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report: Treasurer, Laura Clifton, presented the report. Laura will check on renewing the parsonage CD for six more months. She has visited with an insurance agent regarding coverage options. The agent needs to know specific details about the church, such as the age of the roof, etc. After a brief discussion on these topics, Jan moved to approve. Joyce seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor's report: Pastor Gordy reported we had some great numbers in attendance for our Easter services. Easter morning there were 130 present for the service.

Committee reports:

Property committee – Kirby mentioned there are problems with the PA system. It is possibly a wiring issue. We need someone to take a look at it.

Old Business

Parsonage funds: Two individuals have volunteered to be on the committee. We will continue to look for a few more.

Annual Performance Review of the Pastor: A committee needs to be established to complete a review once Gordy has been here a year. We will discuss in a future meeting.

Community Committee: Mike Apley is organizing the cemetery work for this group. We discussed the planting of grass in one area and what type of grass might be best. Mike is going to discuss with a turf expert to get some suggestions.

Council Member Replacement: We will continue to look for a council member to replace Donica.

Floor Repairs: There is some wear on the wood flooring. We tentatively scheduled a work day for both inside and outside projects. The date is May 3rd following church.

New business

Vacation Bible School: Sonja is our coordinator for VBS.

Prayer Partners: Council members from the Olsburg and Walsburg churches have been assigned prayer partners. Pastor Gordy encouraged us to be in contact with our partners from Walsburg.

Worship Review: We discussed our Lenten services. The council had very positive feedback and felt a similar format should be used again next year. We also discussed worship services in general.

Contemporary Worship: There has been some interest expressed in a contemporary worship - possibly a service held once a month. We would need to consider several factors such as music needs, etc. This is not something we're planning for the immediate future, but we need to keep dialog going regarding this topic. This might be something that would attract others to our church. We discussed how the church should be about mission and outreach.

Worship Folders: The council is looking at the possibility of using worship folders. We also discussed moving to a new hymnal. The newer hymnals are progressive and timely; however, they are also traditional.

Projection System: The council discussed the need for a projection system. We should explore the possibilities of how this system might be useful to the church.

Partnership for Missional Church: Pastor Gordy informed the group about this partnership. There are three meetings a year to work as a team throughout a five year process. It involves being a part of a cluster with other congregations. An informational meeting is coming up on May 13th. Anyone interested is welcome to join Gordy at the meeting.

Sexuality Statement: There was a discussion held on this with regard to the National Church Convention.

Upcoming Events: The Luther League plant sale is May 9th. Vacation Bible School will be June 15-19. The youth gathering in New Orleans is July 22-26.

The meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

Synod Assembly will also fall in this time frame so during June 4-7 she will be in Lindsborg at Synod Assembly but will be reachable by phone.




