Reflections by Pastor Keith

On June 10, I met with our two church councils, along with the call committee, to discuss where we are at with calling a pastor. It has been four and a half years since I began serving as your interim pastor. During this time the call committee has worked faithfully and diligently, putting in long hours. Four candidates have been considered, but none of the four was a good match. It has now been well over a year since the synod identified a possible candidate for the call committee to consider.

At the meeting on June 10 we discussed the growing shortage of pastors in our church. For example, at the recent synod assembly I learned that in the past year, our synod (174 churches in Kansas and Missouri) gained four new pastors, but lost 20 pastors to retirement or moving out of the synod. And so we confronted the question, what if we don't get a new pastor any time soon? While the right pastor could show up at any time, we talked about the possibility that it could be quite awhile before that happens. And so we must prepare for this new "normal," while at the same time keeping our eyes on the goal of calling a full time pastor.

As we seek to accomplish this larger goal, we dare not just coast along. We must aggressively strive to be the church God wants us to be in this part of Kansas. This includes, at the very least, clarifying what it is that God wants us to do. studying options for pastoral leadership in congregations of our size, identifying leaders within our congregations to take on some pastoral responsibilities, and growing congregational income and active membership.

When I started as your interim pastor, the agreement was for me to work half time. Each year, though, the number of hours has increased, to where now it is nearly full time. I need to make some adjustments. I would like to have more time and greater flexibility to pursue retirement - to spend time with family and grandchildren, to do numerous projects I have been waiting to do for years, to travel, and so forth.

I am certainly willing to continue working with you - if that is your desire. And I am looking forward to helping you transition into a new way of doing ministry in our two congregations. Also, since we are moving into a new "normal," I am sensing that I need to give more attention to planning, leading, teaching and mentoring. We need to make adjustments so that all of this can happen.

At the June 10 meeting of the two councils and call committee it was agreed that since we do not foresee our interim situation changing any time soon, we need to develop a plan of action for the next few years. The councils and I will be working on this in the coming months.

Meanwhile, keep the faith! Pray daily. Worship weekly. Read the Bible. Serve in and beyond the church. Give generously of your time, talents, and financial resources.

Remember, we have what we need in order to do what God wants us to do at this time, in this place! In Philippians 4:19 God promised to "fully satisfy every need of yours according to his riches in Christ Jesus." And God will do that!

I would like to close with a prayer we prayed together at the June 10 meeting: O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
