# **Reflections from Pastor Keith**

"O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever." (Psalm 107:1)

Long before Abraham Lincoln established a national day of Thanksgiving in 1863, and long before the Pilgrims gathered with Native Americans for a day of Thanksgiving in 1621, people of faith were giving thanks.

The Psalms in the Old Testament are filled with expressions of giving thanks to God. The New Testament continues this spirit of giving thanks. In 1 Thessalonians 5 we read, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." The early Christians were most thankful for Jesus! Such gratitude is expressed clearly in 1 Corinthians 15:57, "Thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!"

Christians give thanks! That's what we do!

When Christians gather for worship, the Liturgy for Holy Communion is one great expression of thanksgiving. The pastor says, "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God." And we all respond, "It is right give our thanks and praise." Then the pastor says, "It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all

times and in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God!"

We express praise and thanksgiving to God as we sing, "Holy, holy, holy Lord, Lord God of pow'r and might!" Then we give thanks at the table as the pastor leads us:

"In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take and eat; this is my body, given for you.

Do this for the remembrance of

and gave it for all to drink, saying:

This cup is the new covenant in my blood.

shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of

me."

Almost immediately Christians began referring to this Meal as the **Eucharist** which is the Greek word for "giving thanks." They gathered every Sunday (the weekly remembrance of Easter!) to give thanks as they experienced the presence of the Risen Christ among them and within them.

They called it their *Eucharist*. It was their Thanksgiving Meal.

The *Eucharist* is our Thanksgiving Meal. For all that Christ has done for us and for the world, we give thanks. For sins forgiven and life with God, we give thanks. For strength and courage for daily living and Spirit-power to help us work for justice and peace, we give thanks. For all who share in this Meal, both now and in ages past and in ages to come, we give thanks. As we eat the bread and drink from the cup we give thanks. This Meal is our *Eucharist*, our Meal of Thanksgiving.

The *Eucharist* shapes our lives.
Thanksgiving is a way of life for us who follow Jesus. Thanksgiving for us does not just happen on the fourth Thursday in November. As we say in the Liturgy, "It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should *at all times and in all places give thanks and praise* to you, almighty and merciful God!" Thanksgiving is what we do every day!

I am thankful for so very much! God has richly blessed me. I want you to know how thankful I am for each of you. Carol and I often talk about what a blessing you are in our lives. Every day we thank God for you!

Have a blessed Thanksgiving! Not just during these November days, but always!

# OLC Council Highlights from September Meeting

The Olsburg Lutheran Church Council met on Tuesday, September 17, 2019. The following items were discussed:

- On November 3rd, the Bishop will be here for a visit. There will be a potluck at Walsburg following service there. This will be a time to have open discussion with the Bishop.
- There are church members who have volunteered to do lawn care and landscaping such as fertilizing the grass, putting down landscape rock by the sidewalk, and planting mums in the flower beds. The council is appreciative of everyone who has volunteered to do this work and also those who have mowed throughout the year.
- Church elections will be held in October. There are three open council positions. The council terms begin December 1st. The date for elections was set for October 20th.
- Again this year, we will decorate the outside of the church prior to the Swedish Supper. Lights will be purchased with money from the general fund.
- The Call Committee is currently speaking with a pastoral candidate. The Olsburg and Walsburg councils are interested in further discussion with this individual and will make plans for a visit in the near future.
- A decision was made to have a joint council meeting on Sunday, September 22nd. Each council needs to examine their budget and determine how we will support a pastor since overall tithing has declined in recent years.

- Discussion regarding the middle aisle flooring will be held during the congregational election meeting. Do we want to leave the wood floor exposed or do we want to put down carpet like we've had in the past? This will give the congregation an opportunity to voice their opinions. The carpet is purchased but we would have to pay for the installation labor.
- The council continued discussion on rock for the Olsburg Cemetery driveway. This is an on-going project that is dependent upon the weather and availability of workers.

The meeting adjourned with The Lord's Prayer.


