## **Reflections from Pastor Kaylie**

#### Fall Theological Conference

There are two major events that a rostered leader (in the Central States Synod) is required to attend: 1. Synod Assembly, 2. Fall Theological Conference (formerly known as Bishop Convocation.) Fall Theological Conference is a week filled with opportunities to dive into the seminar theme, time for fellowship, worship, and conversations with colleagues. This year's conference theme was "How to Wrestle with God's Word." This conference brought in two keynote speakers; The Rev. Dr. Ray Pickett (Rector/President of Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary) and The Rev. Laurie Jungling (Bishop of the Montana Synod.)

As a synod the Central States adopted this new mission statement, "United with Christ in Baptism. Traveling the Way of Jesus. Joining God's reign of justice and radical love for the world." Most of our time together we unpacked our synod's newest mission statement. We had the opportunity to unpack this mission statement and wrestle with its theological meaning. Some questioned we asked were "how does this reflect the gospel? How does it reflect our understanding of grace? How does this deepen our understanding of faith?" The week was filled with good and challenging questions.

As the Church is ever-changing it is important we take time to discuss those changes and remodel our mission with the changes of the world. Ultimately, this new mission statement hopes to inspire congregations and people to live out our baptismal calling. Which is to be people of God who "live among God's faithful, to hear the word of God and partake in communion, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth."

#### When Peace Like a River-

ELW hymn 785, When Peace Like a River, may be a familiar tune. Hear the first verse and the refrain in your head:

1 When peace, like a river, attendeth my way, When sorrows like sea billows roll; Whatever my lot, Thou has taught me to say,

It is well, it is well, with my soul. *Refrain*

It is one of the most honest hymns in that it acknowledges the presence of trouble and sorrows. Troubles and sorrows, though not always present in life, do come into our lives. They can roll in like sea

billows or like 20ft waves crashing against the shore. It can be heavy rainfall that does not seem to stop or slow down. And while all may not be well in those very moments of sorrows and trouble, it is God's promise that all will be well eventually. When those waves and troubling sea storms enter in our lives may we remember who our God is. Our God promises to never leave our side. We have a God we faces the troubling sea storm and enters into sorrow with us. When life is hard and God feels far off may we remember God clings to us and journeys with us. Until we can find our voice to sing "it is well, it is well, with my soul" may we cling to God the Creator of All. And may we hold onto the love and grace of God who will carry us through until all is well. For all will be well in the arms of God. Amen.
