## **From the Desk of Your Interim Pastor**

### **Greetings in the Name of Jesus!**

It is a great privilege and joy for me to serve as your interim pastor. I have long admired the Olsburg and Walsburg congregations and for the past several months Carol and I have been discovering first hand that these are indeed two wonderful congregations of faithful people!

Now as I move from the pew to the pulpit, let me share a little about me. I am a native Kansan. I was born in southwest Kansas and lived in Copeland, a small town about 35 miles from Garden City, until I was seven when we moved to Pratt.

It was in Pratt that I met Carol and we started dating. Carol grew up on a dairy farm just outside of Pratt. When we finished college, we got married and moved to St. Louis where I entered seminary. I did three months of clinical pastoral education at the Topeka State Hospital in Topeka and a year of internship in Los Angeles.

After graduating from seminary, I was called to Trinity Lutheran Church in Great Bend, Kansas. Part of my call was to start a new congregation in St. John, a small

community 25 miles south of Great Bend. After a couple of years, Carol and I moved to St. John to give more attention to the fledgling congregation. Shortly after that, I also began serving the Lutheran Church in Garfield, about 33 miles west of St. John.

Both of these churches were in small, rural communities. While the congregation in St. John was brand new, the congregation in Garfield was over a hundred years old. It was rooted in the Swedish tradition with lots of Nelsons and Petersons and Andersons. Each congregation usually had about 35 - 40 people in worship.

In 1983 I was called to serve First Lutheran in Manhattan, first as an associate pastor, then as senior pastor. And I served there until I retired last June.

### **A Time of Transition**

The coming months will be a time of transition for us, as we grieve the departure of Pastor Gordy and his family. This will also be a time when we begin the process of selecting a new pastor. This means we will be doing a lot of hoping and dreaming and planning for the future.
